Finding shelter faster for survivors of domestic violence and human trafficking.

When a survivor needs urgent help, finding available emergency shelter often includes phone calls to find available beds, whiteboards to track responses, and survivors reliving the trauma with each retelling of their story. The Collaborative stops this cycle.

The Safe Shelter Collaborative provides:

- Technology to maximize the ability to find available and appropriate shelter space.
- The ability to source funding for a hotel room, when that is an appropriate and safe option for the survivor.
- Training and resources on best practices to support survivors of human trafficking.

Locate shelter

When an individual needs shelter, a professional responsible for placing survivors sends one notice that reaches many participating regional agencies. The notice includes enough non-identifying case information so an agency can respond with a placement.

Fund shelter

When there isn't available shelter and the agency has protocols in place to use hotels as emergency housing, a case manager can send an alert to supporters via SafeNight, a free downloadable mobile app, to pay for a hotel stay.
